Will it ever end? As an optimist (albeit tested), I want to pull something positive out of this trying time. One of which is we've learned to adapt and push boundaries we didn't know we had. For instance, who knew we could convert our new patio into an enjoyable socially distanced dining space. **This space has become so relevant and dear in keeping open hours at the Lodge.** It's an amazing space that frankly, will become a key part of our Lodge in "good weather" months for years to come. The space has made us think even bigger. We've now expanded the patio past the gates to the back fence at the large containers, in order seat more people . I know what you're thinking... back by the containers?! Yuck! But seeing is believing (see photo above), the space is really nice and gives us the capability to host events even entertainers with a capacity of seating 46 members at socially distanced tables. With his help and mentorship, we can serve delicious ribs and wings, a new "fat" burger, garden salad, dessert, among many other things. The menu is a work in progress, so look for it to incorporate new items and weekly specials. Oddly, the pandemic was just the push we needed to change and get things done.

I'd like to thank Board members Ben Gibson (Past Governor) for donating the large flat stovetop grill for the kitchen (\$150), Ben Lehr (Treasurer) for donating a new TV can be enjoyed in the patio (\$300), Jim Walker (Governor) who paid for the extended patio carpeting (\$250) and Thommy Palmer for ordering and donating the upcoming new patio misters. I feel like we hit the lottery with these guys – such generosity. **It can't go unmentioned that ALL our Board Officers have stepped up to lend a hand on a daily bases in order to keep the Lodge open and running.** Their pictures are hanging in the hall, get to know them, and give them your appreciation. 

